WORLD RELIGIONS STUDY GROUP

Join us for the FUSN World Religions Study Group (formerly known as the FUSN Bible Study Group). After many years of studying both the Hebrew and Christian scriptures, last year we studied the Koran and then read *Destiny Disrupted*, an eye-opening survey of world history from an Islamic perspective. We have now decided to study Buddhism this fall -- and perhaps go on to other faith traditions after that.

We meet on Tuesday mornings in the Alliance Room, from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. Usually we meet every other week. FUSN member Sue Allen, a practicing Buddhist, will be our facilitator. Judy Zacek will be handling the administrative side of things (e.g., I’ll be sending out meeting reminders).

We have selected as our text Karen Armstrong’s *Buddha*, which is available in paperback. Note that this is a discussion group, not a lecture class.

OPERATIONS COUNCIL

New Accessible Sanctuary Entrance coming soon. We expect to start construction of a ramp to our Highland Street Sanctuary door from the Memorial Garden entrance the week before Labor Day. This will give us an accessible door from the street without having to go down the driveway to the back door which is precarious in the wintertime. This design has gone through several iterations and has been approved by the Massachusetts Historical Commission as is required for our historic building. The plans are posted on the bulletin board across from Fran’s office. The current set of stairs to that door has to be replaced to make the landing big enough for a wheelchair to turn around and we will add lights to make it even more safe to use at night. One of the issues that has taken quite a bit of time to organize is that we have to use the same granite that was used for the original steps. That comes from a quarry that is no longer in regular operation; it just gets accessed for projects like this. If you would like to see how that works, Treff LaFleche, a member of our congregation, had to get this type of granite for a “This Old House” episode on a house he worked on as the architect.
