BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Here are a few updates from the Board of Trustees:

- 1. **Membership Coordinator**: The Board and Erin, in consultation with the Personnel Policy Committee, have decided to hire a new Membership Coordinator, to perform the functions that Kristin's job and many of the membership development and engagement parts of Meghan's job entailed. While we hope to return to an Assistant Minister model at some time in the future, we feel that it is premature to do so at this time. A search committee will be formed shortly, and we hope to be ready for a new Membership Coordinator to start in September.
- 2. **Small Group Conversations**: At the request of the Board of Trustees, the Committee on Ministry organized and administered a program of small conversation groups, each led by a facilitator trained in keeping conversation focused and in helping to insure that participants are able to express themselves and are heard and understood. The goals of this program did not include groups reaching agreements, either about what they heard or about policies that FUSN should adopt; nor did it imagine preventing future disagreements. Rather, the goal was that participants feel a greater sense of safety about expressing feelings and beliefs on controversial issues.

From early February through the first week in March, forty people participated in seven different groups. The question of feedback from the groups to the Board was not clearly addressed beforehand, since the groups were not created with that goal in mind. However, in response to interest among many group participants, the Committee on Ministry shared with the Board some facilitators' general observations, as well as anonymous specific comments where participants so requested.

The Board discussed the feedback at its March meeting, and talked about what might be next in the effort to promote the healing of divisions and coming together as a congregation. There was a consensus of opinion in the Board that our major challenge as a congregation is to focus on exploring what it means to live in a beloved community in which we've become painfully aware that we don't all agree. Erin and the Board will be exploring possible ways to engage those who are interested in this kind of discussion or learning opportunity.

In addition, our ADLRE will be working with the Adult Ed Committee to research and/or develop some learning opportunities on some of the subjects and behaviors that have caused hurt and division, such as: conflict management; polyamory and diverse family structures; communications skills for talking about

difficult issues; pluralism; adult OWL; Welcoming Congregation. While we hope that something can be offered before the end of this church year, it may have to wait until next year, given the research, planning, and possible training required, as well as our already full calendar for the rest of this year.

3. **Bylaw proposals**: As you probably know, the Board has received a proposal that FUSN adopt some language passed by the 2014 General Assembly, enumerating classes of people protected from discrimination. The initial proposal was for a new bylaw to apply to employees of FUSN. That request has since been replaced by a proposal to amend our current membership bylaw by adding the enumerations mentioned. The Board has accepted these proposals for consideration, and for the moment, it has referred them to the Bylaws Committee for study. As with all bylaw proposals, this one will be subject to study and congregational input before the Board determines whether it should come to a congregational vote in June.
