For almost 30 years now I have been actively involved in a sport that by any measure relegates all other forms of competition to mere games... Motorsports, specifically road racing. Maybe I've remained involved because it's the great equalizer, the only sport in which age is not a factor. Literally you can pit a 58 year old up against an 18 year old and not be able to predict the outcome. How does this relate to Universal Unitarianism you might ask... Well many years ago I asked a fellow friend/competitor, "Just how far do you drive into that corner before you hit the brakes?" His answer was, "I stay on the gas until I see the face of God." So I figure with that statement there must be some connection to faith.

Every time I compete, within the first few laps of prerace practice. Whether on a track that I've logged thousands of laps on such as New Hampshire International Speedway or a scary fast, undulating circuit like Palmer's brand new Whiskey Hill road course I ask myself, "Do I still belong? Or have I lost my edge and become old and (more importantly) in the way?" The answer has always been, "you've been lucky enough to discover your passion, pursue it" but the day that changes is the day I shall retire. Essentially what I'm saying is that it is important to understand that I do belong.

Being an individual that believes self-inventory is paramount, the question of whether or not I belong in the FUSN community comes up from time to time. Perhaps without the same degree of gravity the answer has always been yes. My wife and I began attending services when - at the tender age of fifty - our children came into our lives. We felt that we wanted to expose them to some sort of faith, not one as dogmatic as Catholicism in which Valerie and I were brought up. Universal Unitarianism seemed an appropriate fit then, and continues to feel that way for us. Along with the racing community, a group of people who have on many occasions shared joys and sorrows, this is as close to a group of cherished and devoted individuals and families as we've ever come across. We believe in what we've found within the seven principles.

Although I came into racing and FUSN later than many, I intend to remain for life. So with this month's theme of belonging... I can't speak for everyone, but a society that (among other wonderful practices) occasionally makes reference with reverence to Dr. Suess is most certainly a place where my family and I belong. I'm hoping you all share similar sentiments.

### **BLACK LIVES MATTER**

"How could FUSN support the Black Lives Matter movement?" Sunday Dec. 6 After Services.

In her Oct. 4 sermon on the theme of humility, Erin invited the congregation to consider how we will we answer the call to support the Black Lives Matter (BLM) movement. A group of people who expressed interest after that sermon met to discuss this topic on October 29 and came up with a variety of ideas and learning objectives, including:

• Study the BLM movement calls for solidarity and discuss their implications for FUSN;

• Glean lessons learned from other UU congregations with relevant experience (including initiatives that have fostered authentic sustainable relationships across various experiential and power divides);

• Request that the FUSN Multicultural Ministry Initiative develop relevant programming for the FUSN community (e.g. on the history, culture, and demands of the BLM, and on being an anti-racist ally).

This December, FUSN will again be selling cut balsam firs for holiday decorating. For any newcomers reading this: we set up a lot in the back yard of the church and sell trees to FUSNites and the general community. All the set-up, sales, and clean-up are

handled by volunteers from the congregation. It's a lot of work, a lot of fun, and a significant fundraiser for the church.

The trees—400 of them—are scheduled to arrive this year on Tuesday, Dec 1. Mark that date on your calendar, because we need every able-bodied person we can get to help unload the truck. We will be open for business starting the weekend of the Holiday Fair.

We have a table at coffee hour every Sunday for the rest of the month, where folks can order and pre-pay for trees—receiving a \$5 discount in the process—and sign up for a shift on the sales lot. Additionally, the Tree Team is looking for another permanent member. No experience necessary—although a certain tolerance for cold weather is helpful.
