STAYING IN YOUR HOME

Tuesday- Nov. 13-7:30 p.m., Chapel. In 1950 the average life expectancy was 68 years, and 26% of those over age 85 lived in nursing homes. Now lifespans are 78 years, and 13% live in nursing homes. Most Americans today hope to remain engaged, active, and at home. Looking at the implications of this change will be Deborah Pierce, an architect and author, who will discuss what you can do to make your home safe and comfortable while Barney Freiberg-Dale will discuss how to coordinate the services you will or may need as you remain in your home. There will be plenty of time for questions as well a book-signing of Deb's new book.
